

Guidelines and Format for Clinical Research and Case Abstracts

Guidelines

- Presenters must bring a poster to the poster hall to present.
- Poster presenters are responsible for printing their own poster.
- Title should be succinct (20 word maximum) and descriptive.
- Abstract body limited to 500 words maximum.
- Maximum one image (e.g. EKG or graph or table, etc.)
JPEG format only, maximum file size 500 kb, maximum pixel size 600 x 800. Your one image does not count towards word count. For higher quality output, set image at 300 dpi and crop out unnecessary surrounding white space.
- Use generic names of drugs.
- Use only standard abbreviations. Place special or unusual abbreviations in parenthesis after the full word appears the first time.
- Where applicable, include an acknowledgment of funding sources of a commercial nature and/or consulting or holding of significant equity in a company that could be affected by the results of the study.
- Posters should be in landscape orientation and must be readable from at least three feet away.
- Include all information from your original abstract submission on your poster.
- Include the required disclosure information for the primary author and lead investigator in the bottom right-hand corner of your poster.
- Posters are to remain displayed until the end of the conference on September 22. Posters remaining on boards or on the floor area after the conclusion of the conference will be removed for discard.

Format

Clinical research abstracts must use the following layout:

Objective
Background
Methods
Results (if relevant)
Conclusion

Case abstracts must use the following layout:
Introduction/Objective (case context and importance)
Case Description
Discussion
Conclusion
