Key issues relating to preauthorization, Medicare cuts, and cardiac rehab were discussed with state legislators' teams at the US Capitol. It's been a busy fall for our Advocacy Team. Along with Catarina Stromberg, Executive Director and Dan Kline, Senior Health Advisor, our Advocacy Team traveled to Washington, DC, in mid-October to attend the ACC Legislative Conference and participate in visits to Capitol Hill, where each state's delegation visited their respective elected representatives to promote ACC's main priorities this year of stopping Medicare cuts and increasing access to patient care (H.R.2474), expanding patient access to cardiovascular services (H.R. 2583); streamlining prior authorization practices (H.R.4968), increasing access to AEDs (H.R. 2370) and reducing unnecessary amputations (H.R. 4261). The team visited six members and/or their staff of the Michigan Congressional Delegation. We would like to thank Drs. Karthik Ananth, Sunil Rao, Raid Saco and Peter Fattal for dedicating their time to attend this important conference and the Capitol Hill meetings. <u>Click here to read more.</u>

## New ACC/AHA Guideline Focuses on Diagnosis, Management of AFib

The newest clinical guideline released by the ACC and the American Heart Association (AHA) provides new and updated recommendations for preventing and optimally managing atrial fibrillation (AFib). The 2023 ACC/AHA/ACCP/HRS Guideline for the Diagnosis and Management of Atrial Fibrillation includes new recommendations addressing AFib and thromboembolic risk assessment, anticoagulation, left atrial appendage occlusion, AFib catheter or surgical ablation, as well as risk factor modification and prevention.
